Living on my own I have to devise methods of being able to do things without help. A good example of this is when erecting the hood on No. 85. It is only recently I have given any thought as how to keep the hood's windscreen overlap edging material on the outside whilst erecting the hood. Four bulldog clips of the foldback type are a great help when fitted to the edge in question. Having done one side, by transferring the clips to the other end the overlap hood material can be kept on the outside of the windscreen. 1½" wide foldback clips are ideal and can be purchased from most stationers.
