
THE CAR THAT HAS BROUGHT SO MUCH HAPPINESS

RESTORATION/MAINTENANCE OF SOFT TOPS.

I bought some products called RENOVO Soft Top Car Care, which appear to work really well. They come either in kit form or individually.

The hood on the Porsche was looking very tatty and I saw these products "tested" in a classic car magazine. With nothing to loose but the cost of the products I sent for cleaner, colour and waterproofer and plastic rear screen revivor. The cost was around £60.00 from:

I think the colour range is limited but the dark blue I wanted for the Porsche was available.

Follow the instructions provided !! All the roof products are "thin" liquids and should be painted on with a new, clean paintbrush (I used a 40 mm brush).

With the cleaner applied, I cleaned the soft top with a sponge, washed it off and left the car in the garage for 24 hours (Clean the brush!)

Apply the colour and leave it for another 24 hours. I then repeated the colour application and left it again. Wipe the colour splashes off the paintwork NOW!

I then applied the two coats of waterproofer at 24 hour intervals.

It really looked like a new hood! I did the job in January, so it's had 6 months use and no fading or other problems.

I cleaned the rear screen with the supplied product with moderate success. It was very "cloudy" and the cleaner has improved things. Although it is not as clear as a glass window, I can now see through the window quite clearly.

I only waterproofed the Naylor hood as I didn't have any black colour but the result is excellent. The rainwater seems to sit on top of the hood now.

Both cars have been out in heavy rain and the products seem to work very well.

There is another product available for restoring the rear screens, which is meant to be better, because it also oils the screen. (Cost £40.00 ish) I don't know if it is any better than the other – I haven't tried it – just saw it in a magazine. They also have a web site www.hindsightuk.co
