DEAR EDITOR.


I have recently fitted a battery isolating switch to my Hutson "TF-1700". This small device replaces a terminal on top of the battery and incorporates a removable fuse bar. It is excellent for low usage periods....the laying up season, and provides security during the "going season". the fuse bar plug is easily carried in a pocket.

Just one other point, when fitting a new battery, I always write the starting date on the battery top with a felt tip or similar pen. Batteries always seem to be older than you think!

A small tip which you may wish to include in "TOOLBOX" sometime, for those with door catches which rattle (as mine did).

Wrap a piece of plastic insulating tape around the small lock pillar on the B post a couple of times. This is sufficient to stop the jaws of the lock rattling without interefering with the lock's efficiency.
